

First off, thank you for considering submitting an abstract to UCON 2023. Feel free to submit up to two ideas. Because customer presentations are a MINT UCON fan favorite and add value to the user community, we are looking forward to your ideas and abstracts.

### Abstract Format & Submission

For your abstract submission, you'll need the following elements:

- Title
- Content Description (80-200 words)

For example, the CSE team gave a presentation on new v.14.2 features during one of our MINTinars. Their abstract might have looked like this:

<b>Title:</b>
Taking Advantage of New v.14.2 Features
<b>Content Description:</b>
Here at our organization, we used to see misleading information in the status column of the resource table when selecting multiple record items. The system would only show us a single status, and we couldn't filter for multiple statuses (e.g., wanting to see only resource record items with a problem, warning, or deactivated status).  Additionally, we had no way to implement password complexity requirements because users couldn't be forced to change their password on a large scale without manual work.  To solve both these problems, we utilized some of the features introduced in v.14.2 to expand the status column functionality and increase our system security by forcing users to change their password.

We will review them based on relevance and innovative ways of using MINT TMS and get back to you by April 5<sup>th</sup>. If you are selected, you will receive a 50% discount code for UCON rates.
